Andhra Pradesh:

Mangrove cover registers healthy growth in Andhra Pradesh



- The India State of Forest Report (ISFR) 2017, released by the Forest Survey of India on Monday, shows that there has been a net increase of 37 sq. km of mangrove cover across Andhra Pradesh since 2015
- "Protection measures being taken in the sanctuaries, afforestation taken up in the past few years are the very immediate reasons for the increase in mangrove cover. Those planted a few years ago could only be traced in the satellite imagery," State Chief Wildlife Warden N. Pradeep Kumar told.

Meet Avani, first Indian woman to fly a fighter aircraft solo

- Scripting history, Flying Officer Avani Chaturvedi has become the first Indian woman to fly a fighter aircraft solo, an IAF official said. "Chaturvedi became the first Indian woman to fly a fighter aircraft solo when she flew a MiG-21 Bison," the official said. She undertook the sortie from IAF's Jamnagar base.
- Three women pilots Ms. Chaturvedi, Bhawana Kanth and Mohana Singh had undergone strenuous training programme to fly fighter jets.

'Illegal immigration from Bangladesh planned

But as brick-and-mortar branches vanish from the rolling Franconia region of northern Bavaria, the neatly dressed savings bank executive jumps behind the wheel four days a week to bring mobile services — including cash machine and consultation room — to tiny countryside villages.

Pakistan Supreme Court disqualifies Nawaz Sharif as PML-N chief

- Pakistan's Supreme Court on February 21 disqualified former Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif as head of the ruling Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz. This followed his disqualification as Prime Minister in July 2017 for not being truthful in his tax returns.
- "An individual disqualified under Articles 62 and 63 cannot serve as party head," a three-judge Supreme Court bench headed by Chief Justice of Pakistan Mian Saqib Nisar said in a short order.

Bangladesh fears exodus of Bengalis from Assam

• The ongoing process of compiling the National Register of Citizens in Assam may trigger an exodus of Bengalis and create one more Rohingya-like refugee crisis for **Bangladesh**, senior officials of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina's government said.

EPFO lowers interest rate to 8.55 p.c. for 2017-18

- Retirement fund body EPFO february 21 lowered the rate of interest on employees provident fund to 8.55 per cent for its over 6-crore subscribers for 2017-18, from 8.65 per cent in the previous fiscal.
- This year, we have decided to recommend 8.55 per cent for 2017-18, which will leave a surplus of Rs 586 crore," Labour Minister Santosh Gangwar told reporter after the Employees' Provident Fund Organisation's (EPFO) trustees meet.

CPS eyes 250 cr. from vehicle users

- Central Parking Services, a parking management company, is targeting revenues of □ 250 crore during the next financial year, an increase of 257%, as metropolitan cities in India expand and people owning cars grow, a top official said.
- The Bengaluru-based firm is also planning to raise \$50 million from private equity investors within the next six months to fund its growth
