Country	Date	Important Events during Visit
Belgium	March 30,2016	For Attend First India–European Union (EU) Summit
United States	March 31 - April 1, 2016	For Attend Nuclear Security Summit
Saudi Arabia	April 2,3, 2016	Modi is first Indian conferred Saudi Arabia’s highest civilian honour.The agenda of this visit was energy, security, trade and well-being of Indian workers
Iran	May 22,2016	Prime minister Narendra Modi paid an official visit to Iran.The visit focused on bilateral connectivity and infrastructure, an energy partnership, and trade.
Afghanistan	June 4,2016	Narendra Modi inaugurated the Afghan-India Friendship Dam on the river Hari in Chist-e-Sharif in Herat province. During his visit he was also conferred with Afghanistan's highest civilian award Amir Amanullah Khan Award
Qatar	June 4,2016	Held talks with Emir of Qatar Tamim bin Hamad Al Thani on bilateral issues including to boost economic ties and in the hydrocarbon sector
Switzerland	June 6,2016	Narendra Modi visited Geneva in 2016 to strengthen the bilateral relations of the two countries. He raised the black money issue with Swiss Government and secured its support for the Indian claim to NSG membership which later Switzerland refuted and took a U-turn on India's NSG (Nuclear Suppliers Group) bid.
United States	June 6,8,2016	Held progress review meeting with President Barack Obama on defence, security and energy, and also addressed a joint session of American Congress
Mexico	June 9,2016	Held discussions regarding Nuclear Suppliers Groupmembership
Uzbekistan	June 23,24,2016	For Attend SCO Summit
Mozambique	July 7,2016	To increase cooperation and boost cultural linkages. Meet President Filipe Nyusi
China	Sep 4,5,2016	For Attend G-20 Summit

Laos	Sep 7,8,2016	For Attend East Asia Summit
Japan	November 11,12, 2016	Prime Minister Narendra Modi visit to Japan signed a deal with his counterpart Shinzo Abe on nuclear energy. The deal took six years to negotiate, delayed in part by the 2011 Fukushima nuclear disaster. This is the first time that Japan signed such deal with a non-signatory of Non-Proliferation Treaty. The deal gives Japan the right to supply nuclear reactors, fuel and technology, to India. This deal aimed to help India build the six nuclear reactors planned in Delhi, to be completed by 2032.
