NASA records first likely 'quake' on Mars

 NASA's robotic Mars InSight lander has recorded a likely "marsquake" for the first time ever, the U.S. space agency reports. The faint seismic signal, detected by the lander's Seismic Experiment for Interior Structure (SEIS) instrument, was recorded on April 6, the lander's 128th Martian day.
