## May 18 - World AIDS Vaccine Day

- World AIDS Vaccine Day, also known as HIV Vaccine Awareness Day, is observed annually
  on May 18. The concept of World AIDS Vaccine Day is rooted in a May 18, 1997
  commencement speech at Morgan State University made by then-President Bill Clinton.
- The first World AIDS Vaccine Day was observed on May 18, 1998 to commemorate the anniversary of Clinton's speech, and the tradition continues today.
