	fighter Pingali Venkayya	flag on which the Indian national flag was based was born on
		August 02 in 1876, near Machilipatnam in Andhra Pradesh.
		Today is his 143rd birth anniversary. Venkayya's design for
		the National Flag was finally approved by Mahatma Gandhi
		in a Congress meeting in Vijayawada in 1921.

		Japan's unconditional surrender. The bomb was nicknamed
		'Fat Man' in reference to Winston Churchill 'Fat Man' killed
		80,000 people on 9th August, 1945.

August 13	International Lefthanders	International Left Handers Day is observed annually on
	Day	August 13 to celebrate the uniqueness and differences of the
		left handers. The day was first observed in the year 1976 by
		Dean R. Campbell, founder of the Lefthanders International.
August 14	Pakistan Independence Day	Youm-e-Azadi or Pakistan Independence Day is observed
		annually on 14 August. On this day Pakistan achieved
		Independence and was declared a sovereign nation following
		the end of British rule in 1947.
August 15	73rd Independence Day	Independence Day is annually celebrated on 15 August,
		commemorating the nation's independence from the United
		Kingdom on 15 August 1947. The UK Parliament passed the
		Indian Independence Act 1947 and transferred legislative
		sovereignty to the Indian Constituent Assembly.

		August to pay tribute to aid workers who risk their lives in
		humanitarian service, and to rally support for people affected
		by crises around the world.
August 20	World Mosquito Day	World mosquito day is celebrated annually on August 20. It
		is a commemoration of a British doctor, Sir Ronald Ross's
		discovery in 1897 that 'female mosquitoes transmit malaria
		between humans'. The London School of Hygiene and
		Tropical Medicine organizes world mosquito day
		celebrations every year, since the 1930s.
