- September 5 National Teachers' Day
- Minister of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution Ram Vilas Paswan announced a blanket ban on all types of single-use plastic products in his Ministry and its all PSUs from 15th of this month.
- In Meghalaya, a four-day international symposium on buckwheat with the theme "diversifying food systems for health and nutritional security" is being organised by North Eastern Hills University, Shillong from 3rd to 6th September 2019.
- India and Pakistan agreed to visa-free travel of Indian pilgrims, without any restrictions based on their faith for the Kartarpur Sahib Corridor.
- Russia will launch a special stamp to commemorate the 150th birth anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi, Indian Ambassador to Moscow D.B. Venkatesh Varma said.
- About 70 hatchlings of the rare Black Softshell and Indian Softshell turtles bred in the ponds of two temples in Assam were released in the Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary, about 50 km east of Guwahati.
- India has pipped the Netherlands to move into the list of top ten countries in terms of total gold reserves.
- The Reserve Bank of India has made it mandatory for banks to link all of their new loan products, be it personal, housing or auto to an external benchmark like the policy repo rate.
- Director Rishi Kumar Shukla inaugurated the 1st National Conference on Cyber Crime Investigation and Cyber Forensics at CBI Headquarters in New Delhi.
- The national capital has dropped by six places to rank 118th on a list of the world's most liveable cities due to increase in cases of petty crimes and poor air quality, an annual survey by the Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU).
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Russian President Vladimir Putin during discussed ways to bolster cooperation in trade and investment, oil and gas, nuclear energy, defence, space and maritime connectivity.

- 16 MoUs signed during Tamil Nadu Chief Minister's U.S. visit, Tamil Nadu was India's second largest State economy, performing higher than the national average on various economic and developmental fronts, with a highly educated population and skilled labour force.
